Michigan child passenger safety laws are changing. See below for how the law has changed Remember, safest practice is to always make sure safety belts, car seats, and boosters are snug and not too big.

Before April 2025

After April 2025

Rear Facing



Children have to be in a rear-facing car seat until the child is either:

- · At least 1 year old.
- Under 20 lbs.

Children have to be in a rear-facing car seat until the child is either:

- · At least 2 years old.
- Over the weight or height limit set by the maker.

Forward Facing



Children under 4 years old must ride in a back seat if possible. If all back seats are taken by children under 4, then they may ride in a car seat in the front seat. A child in a rear-facing car seat may only ride in the front seat if the airbag is turned off.

Children have to be in a forward facing car seat, <u>with an internal harness</u>, until the child is either:

- At least 5 years old.
- Over the weight or height limit set by the maker.

Booster Seat



Children have to be in a belt-positioning booster seat, secured with a lap-to-shoulder safety belt, until the child is either:

- · At least 8 years old.
- At least four feet nine inches tall.

Children have to be in a belt-positioning booster seat, secured with a lap-to-shoulder safety belt, until the child is either:

- At least 8 years old.
- · At least four feet nine inches tall.

Back Seat & Buckled



Children, ages 8-15, must buckle up in any seat in a vehicle.

Age 16 and up, people in front seats, both driver and passenger, must buckle up.

Children under 13 years old, must:

- · Use a properly fitting safety belt.
- Be in the back seat, if there are back seats that are not all taken by other children.

Keep Kids Safe with Free Gun Locks

Michigan's secure storage law was passed to help protect Michigan families – particularly children – from the tragedies of gun violence and unintentional firearm injuries.

To obtain a free cable gun lock, residents can visit a local MDHHS office to request one or check with their local health department, some of which also have gun locks available. MDHHS staff who make home visits can access gun locks if a client has a need or requests one.

Tips with Tosha

Well-Child Visits are Important!



Well-child checks are so beneficial and important to everyone involved. They can be easy to skip, but we highly encourage you to keep them! They are a great time to discuss concerns, detect health problems early, make sure vaccinations are up to date, monitor developmental milestones, and get referrals when needed. Detecting problems early means better long-term outcomes. Early intervention is key! Some parents are afraid to 'label' their kids. Labels simply help your child get the services and supports they need for success. It doesn't define or change who they are. Well-child checks also give you and your child a chance to learn about their health and interact with their medical care provider. If your child is nervous about going, you can ease their anxiety by explaining the purpose of the visit, preparing them with stories, and reinforcing positive experiences with rewards and praise. If you feel uncomfortable with your provider, know that you're never locked into any specific doctor. It is okay to get a second or third opinion if you feel you need one. If your doctor gets mad because you seek another opinion, it might not be the right fit for your family. It is your right to find a doctor you are comfortable with. This benefits your child's health and future by fostering a positive relationship with their healthcare providers. Did you know you don't need a pediatrician for your child? A family doctor is perfectly acceptable, especially in a smaller community where it's harder to find pediatricians accepting new patients. A doctor's visit can be a fun learning experience for everyone involved and promotes lifelong good health!

Baked Bananas

Bananas make the perfect dessert when you add brown sugar and raisins!



Ingredients

- 6 bananas, sliced lengthwise
- 6 tablespoons packed brown sugar
- 4 tablespoons margarine or butter
- 1/2 cup raisins, or other dried chopped fruit
- 1/3 cup chopped pecans

Directions

- 1. Wash hands with soap and water.
- 2. Preheat oven to 350 °F.
- 3. Lightly grease a 9x13 inch pan.
- 4. Arrange the split bananas in the pan.
- 5. Top evenly with brown sugar, small pieces of margarine, raisins, and pecans.
- 6. Bake for 30 minutes.

Pro tips:

- Try adding ½ teaspoon (or more) cinnamon or a dash of cayenne to the other toppings.
- When bananas are peeled or cut, the flesh starts to brown. Browned bananas might not look attractive but they are safe to eat. Reduce browning by peeling or cutting just before using.
