

Tips with Tosha



Summer has arrived, school is out, and the kiddos will be home all day playing and investigating their world. Sometimes that innocent curiosity can lead to trouble. There are thousands of accidents/injuries every year involving children at home. Here are some reminders and tips to help keep your kids safe!



Opened Windows

There are over 5200 accidents a year related to children falling out of windows.

- When opening windows, make sure there is no furniture near the window.
- Install window guards/stops
- Don't rely on window screens. Screens help keep bugs out, but they don't keep children inside.
- Kids can fall out of windows open as little as five inches
- · Keep windows locked when an adult is not nearby.
- · Garage Cleaning and Gardening
- approximately 2.4 million people, more than half under age 6, swallow or have contact with a poisonous substance each year.
- Store all cleaning and gardening products in their original containers
- Swap out heavy cleaning products for non-toxic cleaners when able.
- Keep children away from anything poisonous when in the middle of a project.
- · Install Child Safety locks.
- Poison Control Center 1 800 222 1222 24 hours a day/7 days a week.
- Never leave any containers open or within reach out kids.

Grilling

Children younger than 10 accounted for 21% of emergency department visits for grilling

- Keep kids away from grills. Establish a safety zone. Make sure the zone is at least 10 feet away from the grill.
- Always have kids wear shoes around the grill.
- Keep sharp utensils out of reach.

Yardwork

Each year many children are severely injured by lawnmowers, according to the AAP.

- The AAP recommends not letting children under 12 use a walk-behind mower and not allowing children under 16 to use a riding lawnmower.
- Never let a child use a lawnmower without boots or closedtoe shoes.
- Use safety goggles/glasses with side protectors when using any sort of lawn mowing equipment.
- Make sure lawnmowers have an automatic shut-off mechanism.
- Pick up any items in the lawn that could be potential safety hazards

Swimming

- Adult should always be present when there is access to water
- Use proper safety floaties
- Enroll your kids in swim lessons at a young age.
- Talk to them about rules and expectations for being around water.
- Make sure your pool is fenced in. (Fences should be at yeast four feet high if not higher and have no gaps)
- Install a pool gate alarm
- Keep toys away from the pool unless the pool is actively being used.
