

Beautiful fall crafts

Fall brings opportunities for fun seasonal crafts! One easy one toddlers love is a sticky leaf collage!
Supplies:

- Leaf's, flower petals, and grass
- Contact paper

Directions:

Cut two equal-sized shapes out of clear contact paper. Peel one sheet. Place gathered leaves, flower petals, and grass onto the sticky side of the contact paper into desired design. Peel the other piece of the contact paper and place over design. You can cut the piece into any shape (hearts, circle, letter) Now you have a beautiful piece of nature artwork!

These are super fun to display in windows with the sun shining!

Another beautiful craft is leaf mobiles. There are many easy variations.

Supplies:

- Pretty freshly fallen leaves
- Yarn or string
- Thread (black or white is best)
- Stick(s) or wooden wreath ring

Directions:

Cross 2 -3 sticks and tie in the middle with yarn. Tie the leave stems to the thread, then tie the thread to the end of each stick. Add more leaves until balanced or simply tie them to a single stick or the craft ring. Hang indoors or out. It's best where it can catch a breeze. Throw away when the leaves have withered and make a new one next year!

Baked Carrot Fries With Yogurt-Sunflower Seed Butter Dip

Give your baby carrots a makeover as a healthy snack or sidedish with a tasty dip.



Ingredients

- ¾ cup + 1 Tbsp plain Greek yogurt
- 3 Tbsp sunflower seed butter (or regular butter)
- 4 cups (1 lb 1 oz) baby carrots
- 1/8 tsp salt
- 1½ tsp canola oil

- 1. Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. Preheat oven to 400 °F.
- 3. In a small bowl, combine yogurt and sunflower seed butter. Use a fork or rubber spatula to mix until smooth. Set aside. Keep cold at 40 °F or lower.
- 4. In a small bowl, combine carrots, salt, and oil. Toss.
- 5. Place carrots on a baking sheet in a single layer. Bake for 20 minutes or until lightly brown on the bottom. Heat to 140 °F or higher for at least 15 seconds.
- 6. Serve ½ cup carrot fries (about 6–10) and 2 Tbsp dip. Serve immediately, or keep dip cold at 40 °F or lower and keep carrot fries warm at 140 °F or higher.
